You are responsible for the total program cost, which includes tuition and fees, out-of-pocket expenses, and any additional expenses associated with this program. You are expected secure sufficient financial aid or Agency funding, and/or an established payment plan during your enrollment.

Listed below are some options for how to finance your education.

- Financial Aid. All programs that are 600+ clock hours qualify for financial aid funding. Cosmetology and Hair Stylist are both eligible programs
 - Apply online at www.fafsa.gov. Use federal school code: E00701- Maricopa Skill Center
 - Financial Aid processing takes approximately 4-6 weeks.
 - Verify that you have completed all <u>To Do</u> List items in your Student center at <u>my.maricopa.edu</u>.
 - Determine if you have been awarded, which can be found in your Student Center under Financial Aid and Student Email Account.
 - If you have been awarded loans you must to complete Loan Request form for release please submit the form sent to your student email and return this promptly to the financial aid department or to your Navigator.
 - ❖ Agency Funding. Obtain required paperwork from agency (Maricopa or Phoenix Workforce Connection, Arizona Youth Resources, etc.) These agencies have specific criteria that you must be meet. Please work carefully with your agency. A firm obligation/intent to pay with student name and amount must be received from the agency prior to enrollment.
- Pay In Full (Buy-In). Use cash, check, or credit card to pay in full at time of packet acceptance and admission into the program.







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- Payment Plan (Buy-In). You will be responsible for signing up for the Equal Payment Plan and making your first payment after you have been enrolled in your classes. You are also required to make your payments by the 20th of each month for the amount of their payment plan.
 There are 3 down payment schedules:
 - 10% 10% of 1st block of charges due 2 months prior to start.
 - 20% 20% of 1st block of charges due 1 month prior to start.
 - 40% 40% of 1st block of charges due the month of start.

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Uniforms/Books/Kit

Uniform tops (2) will be provided within the course fees. Bottoms are to be purchased independently. All bottoms need to be black scrub pants with athletic shoes.

Cosmetology books are provided within the program as well as a Cosmetology kit, which you are provided materials that are needed to be successful in class and beginning in the field. Kit items include but are not limited to, mannequin heads, practice shears, professional shears, clippers, blow dryer, thermal irons, tint bowls, disinfectant, capes, bombs and brushes in a tote bag.

To successfully meet the requirements, the Cosmetology program and the Arizona State Board of Cosmetology you must attend 100% of the scheduled hours. There is 5% of makeup time built into each course. If an absence does occur, it is your responsibility to notify your instructor and to make arrangements immediately for makeup time. However, even if you make up hours, once you have missed more than the allowed 5% for the course you are enrolled in you may be withdrawn from the course and the program.

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Refund Policy for Credit/Clock Classes

If you officially withdraw from credit/clock classes (in fall, spring, or summer) within the withdrawal deadlines listed below will receive a 100% refund for tuition, class and registration processing fees. Deadlines that falls on a weekend or a college holiday will advance to the next college workday except for classes fewer than 10 calendar days in length or as specified by the college. Calendar days include weekdays and weekends. Refer to individual colleges for withdrawal and refund processes. Never attending is not an allowable refund exemption or an excuse of the debt incurred through registration.

^{*}Course fees and registration processing fees will be refunded only if the student qualifies for a 100% refund. Debts owed to any MCCCD college must be satisfied before any refunds are paid to the student. Refunds for students receiving federal financial assistance are subject to federal guidelines. Requests for exceptions to the refund policy must be filed within one year from the semester in which the course was taken.

Course Curriculum

All classes are set up as a cohort and each course is completed with a predetermined amount of hours. Class curriculum is comprised of classes that will equal out to fulfill entire program hours. Course curriculum may be subject to change.

COS 112 – Hair Essentials- 400 hrs

COS 119 - Nail Essentials- 200hrs

COS 114 – Student Salon 1- 200hrs

COS 212 - Skin Essentials - 200 hrs

COS 214 - Student Salon 4- 200 hrs

HAIR 118 – Hairstylist Sate Licensure Focus- 200 hrs COS 218 - Cosmetology State Licensure Focus- 200hrs





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COS112 Hair Essentials/ 400 hours

Introduction to the basic theory and procedures in cosmetology hair essentials. Prerequisites: Admission into the Cosmetologist program.

COS114 Student Salon 1/200 hours

Continuation of cosmetology theory and practical concepts at an intermediate level. Theory will be focusing on professional development, salon ecology, anatomy and hair decisions. Practical skills will be demonstrated daily on clients and manikins. Rubrics on procedures are done monthly. One day a month on Arizona state board licensure focus. Prerequisites: COS112 or Program Manager's permission.

COS116 Student Salon 2/200 hours

Apply concepts learned in the classroom and the student salon to develop real life scenarios while servicing a client and/ or becoming a future business owner in the beauty industry. Prerequisites: COS114 or Program Manager's permission.

COS118 Hair Stylist State Licensure Focus/ 200 hours HAIR STYLIST STYUDENTS ONLY

This course is designed to prepare students for the written and practical examinations for the Arizona State Board of Cosmetology HAIRSTYLIST licensure only. Prerequisites: COS116 or Program Manager's permission.

COS119 Nail Essentials/ 200 hours COSMETOLOGY STUDENTS ONLY

Introduction to nail services in the beauty industry. Prerequisites: COS116 or Program Manager's permission.

COS212 Skin Essentials/ 200 hours COSMETOLOGY STUDENTS ONLY

Introduction to skin services in the beauty industry. Prerequisites: COS119 or Program Manager's permission.

COS214 Student Salon 4/ 200 hours COSMETOLOGY STUDENTS ONLY

Prepares cosmetology students to be industry ready and prepared to perform services in their chosen field of expertise after licensure with the Arizona State Board of Cosmetology. Prerequisites: COS212 or Program Manager's permission.

COS218 Cosmetology State Licensure Focus/ 200 hours COSMETOLOGY STUDENTS ONLY

This course is designed to prepare cosmetology students for the written and practical examinations for Arizona State Board of Cosmetology licensure. Prerequisites: COS214 or Program Manager's permission.
