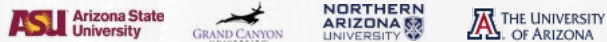




ASSOCIATE IN BUSINESS (ABUS) GENERAL REQUIREMENT

GUIDED FAST TRACK

This program was designed for the part-time, working student who is focused on achieving his / her academic goals. The ABUS program is structured in a cohort model, offering both evening and day time options, providing students with an academic support structure to ensure completion of the program in two and a half years or seven short semesters.

Faculty in the Fast Track program have designed classroom experiences that interconnect the courses in the program while creating practical application assignments that give you an advantage in the job market.
