ADMISSION CRITERIA

1. Formal application can be made at any time.

- Rates are set according to the Arizona Revised Statute. Applies only to counties with no community colleges.

MCCCD BACKGROUND CHECK POLICY REQUIREMENTS

Students seeking admission to an MCCCD Allied Health or Nursing Program (Program) will be required to obtain a valid Level-One Arizona Department of Public Safety Fingerprint Clearance Card (FCC Card) AND a passing score on an MCCCD background check. This policy precludes MCCCD faculty or staff from assigning students to a clinical experience who cannot meet the new requirements.

Upon admission to the program, students are required to present a copy of the DPS card and apply for the MCCCD Background Check. Students bear the financial costs for both the MCCCD Background Check and the AZ Fingerprint Clearance Card. Students will receive Information regarding the MCCCD Background Check after admission, but prior to the beginning of the program.

We encourage students to apply for the card early in the application process. Please allow a minimum of eight weeks processing time for the DPS Level-One Fingerprint Clearance card. The card is valid for six years from the date of issue.

DRUG SCREENING

All allied health students are required to submit to a random pre-clinical urine drug screen according to policy of the specific Allied Health Program. The cost for tests will be the responsibility of the student. The urine drug screen will test for alcoholic beverages; illegal drugs, or drugs that may impair judgment while in the clinical agency. If the drug test is positive for the illegal drugs or undocumented prescription drugs, the student will not be able to continue in the program. **MCCCD policy regarding medical marijuana: "Medical marijuana, or its metabolite, is not an accepted substance in urine drug screens and will result in a positive urine drug screen.** Students with a prescription for medical marijuana would not be considered exempt from urine drug screening". Readmission is at the discretion of the college and the program. Some clinical sites also require screening for nicotine. Students who test positive for nicotine are allowed to continue in the program, but may be limited to clinical agencies that do not test for nicotine.

- ✓ Can adapt well to working variable shifts, including day, evening and night shifts

What are the essential functions of a Neurodiagnostic Technologist?

1. Demonstrate manual and physical dexterity to operate neurodiagnostic equipment and troubleshoot technical issues.
2. Demonstrate fine motor skills sufficient to handle small equipment such as measuring devices or electrodes.
3. Demonstrate visual and auditory acuity to monitor and analyze neurodiagnostic tests and provide appropriate patient care.
4. Demonstrate the physical ability to assist patients in ambulating, positioning in bed, and transferring from the bed, wheelchair, car or gurney.
5. Ability to lift or carry equipment/supplies weighing up to 50 pounds.
6. Physical stamina to tolerate extended periods of standing, bending, sitting or pushing.
7. Ability to maneuver neurodiagnostic equipment in a patient room or hospital setting.
8. Demonstrate effective verbal and written communication skills with internal and external customers.
9. Demonstrate ability to read, write, understand and speak English.
10. Demonstrate critical thinking and problem solving skills for technical issues and patient care.
11. Follow established protocols and guidelines for performing neurodiagnostic procedures.
12. Adhere to safety standards, including infection control measures.
13. Ability to work in and manage stressful situations.
14. Ability to maintain patient confidentiality and uphold ethical standards.
15. Ability to work collaboratively within a healthcare team while respecting diversity and cultural differences.

Students who are unable to perform these functions, with or without reasonable accommodations, may be unsafe in the clinical environment and thus may likely be unsuccessful in the program.

Extenuating Circumstances during clinicals

In the event of extenuating circumstances, including but not limited to pregnancy, medical conditions, or personal emergencies, adjustments to clinical hours may be considered by the program director. Prolonged absences may necessitate an individualized plan for program completion, including possible delays in graduation. It will be the responsibility of the student to speak with the program director to determine the course of action. However, the student must complete all Program and institutional graduation requirements prior to graduation as outlined in

the college catalog.

What credentials are available for a Neurodiagnostic Technologist?

Graduates of an accredited Associates Degree program in Clinical Neurodiagnostic Technology are eligible to sit for the R. EEG T. (ABRET registry exam for electroencephalography technology) and the RPSGT (BRPT registry exam for polysomnography technology).

Can I get financial aid or a scholarship?

Financial assistance is available to eligible GateWay Community College students in the form of grants, scholarships, employment or loans. Students may receive assistance from only one funding source, or aid may be offered in a package from multiple sources. This depends on student eligibility, level of need, packaging policy, and availability of funds. Additional information is available from the Office of Financial Aid Services; call (602)286-8300.

What opportunities exist for career advancement after graduation?

With continued education and/or additional on-the-job training, the Neurodiagnostic Technologist can advance to research, education, management, and registering in additional neurodiagnostic modalities.

If I have a criminal record, will that prohibit me from being successful in this career? Possibly; our clinical agreements with the healthcare facilities require that our students receive a Fingerprint Clearance Card issued by the Arizona Department of Public Safety. Additionally, a student must not be listed on the federal government's Office of the Inspector General's Exclusion List. Students who are unable to obtain either of these clearances will be prohibited from attending their clinical experience.
