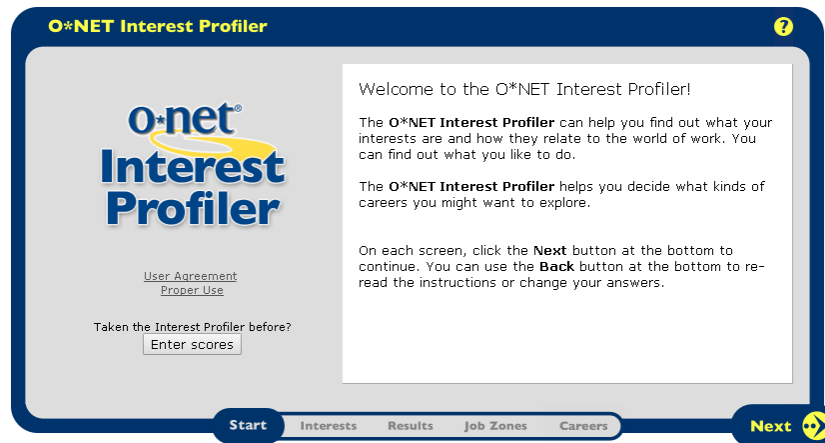


Career Interest Assessment

Often does not like careers that involve paperwork or working closely with others.</p>	<p>_____ Social = People-oriented helper</p> <p>Likes working with others to help them learn and grow; likes working with people more than working with objects, machines, or information.</p>
<p>_____ Investigative = Mental problem solver</p> <p>Likes work that has to do with ideas and thinking rather than physical activity or leading people.</p>	<p>_____ Enterprising = Action-oriented, persuasive leader</p> <p>Likes work that has to do with starting up and carrying out business projects, and taking action rather than thinking about things.</p>
<p>_____ Artistic = Self-expressive creator</p> <p>Likes work that deals with the artistic side of things, such as acting, music, art, and design.</p>	<p>_____ Conventional = Process-oriented worker</p> <p>Likes work that follows set procedures and routines, and prefers working with information and details rather than working with ideas.</p>
